



The church dates from the 19th century and was restored in 1998. You can visit it whenever you want to because the church is open 7/7 !



The town hall is located in Rue du 11 Novembre and the mayor is named Gilles Dupin.



The bridge was built in 1937 and destroyed in 1940 by German troops so a footbridge was temporarily put in place so that people can cross the Loire river.

Water floods are floods that took place in Balbigny. There is a pole which indicates how far the water has risen during the biggest floods. It exists since 1920.

This altar table was used to contain holy wine or animal blood obtained during very ancient rites of the 7th and 8th century AD. That's something you should see at least once in your life !



The Gallo Roman milestone was used to identify a distance. It's located behind the church, it's very impressive.



It's located at Place de Verdun, the Statue of the Republic was inaugurated on July 14, 1889. It weighs 673Kg and was worth 784 francs. There are only 7 statue like this one in the whole France. What about visiting it? This statue is the most amazing of its kind.
